My name is Ayanna Nesbitt and I'm a District 41 resident. I am an early childhood educator and a parent of a bright preschooler. My son and students are being raised during a difficult time for their parents. They see so much more than we used to while being raised. They are exposed to so much and unfortunately are maturing and growing up faster than we'd like. Television, social media, video games, sports, and music alike are all contributing to the upbringing and downfall of our people. I would like to see an education system that encourages youth, hears the youth and responds. How can we respond if we continue to ask and not reply, telling them they can depend on us but they see no action. I believe that the students involved on the school board should have the right to vote. Who better to have a say in their education and their future.

Serving on the school board is a demanding position that is unpaid.
