The Maryland Museums Association, Inc., an 501c3 nonprofit, is in enthusiastic support of HB0688 Historical and Cultural Museum Assistance Program (MAP) at the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT).

From 1991 until 2011, MAP grants served Marylanders by providing operating grants, technical assistance, and educational opportunities to museums, historic sites, and historical societies then the funding stopped. In 2016, the Maryland General Assembly required a report by MHT regarding museum and preservation funding. The report's top recommendation was to reinstitute and fund MAP. Now is the time.

Maryland's organizations have lacked state financial support for too long - yet, countless organizations feed our minds with online lectures during Pandemic lockdowns and let us walk their historic grounds - and sadly, some institutions were not able to endure and have closed.

To ensure that, it is imperative that we support museums of all sizes to care for their collections with professional staff and suitable storage conditions.
