The support provided by the Maryland Historical Trust directly addresses these challenges, fostering impactful enhancements that expand our capacity to welcome visitors to our state. Resources available to small museums dedicated to promoting Maryland's rich heritage remain scarce, underscoring the importance of advocating for this bill.
