Opposition to HB 1414

I am writing to you on behalf of the Maryland Vapor Alliance to express our staunch opposition to the proposed 30% tax on nicotine products. We believe that such a tax would have detrimental consequences for both public health and our local economy. We kindly request your consideration of our concerns and the exploration of alternative solutions.
