Baltimore County **OPPOSES** House Bill 669 – Workers' Compensation – Benefits – Hearing Loss. This legislation would alter the method used to determine the percentage hearing loss for purposes of workers' compensation.

HB 669 would require tinnitus to be considered part of a covered employee's hearing loss. Baltimore County finds this problematic because most tinnitus is subjective and therefore could be feigned. Tinnitus means high-pitched ringing or buzzing that is usually only audible to the affected individual. Most tinnitus is subjective, however objective tinnitus can arise from an aneurysm and can be heard by a medical examiner. Based on the foregoing, the bill should only refer to "objective tinnitus," rather than simply referring to "tinnitus."
