The Department of Information Technology (DoIT) supports Senate Bill 247 - Information Technology - Modernize Maryland Oversight Commission - Membership, Responsibilities, and Staffing. Senate Bill 247 seeks to modify the responsibilities and membership of the Maryland Management and Oversight Committee (MMOC), transforming it into an advisory committee. This change will allow MMOC to focus on advising the Secretary on strategic IT and cybersecurity investments based on industry best practices and related funding sources.

The current mission of MMOC, which focuses on ensuring the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of information held in State systems, overlaps with the duties performed by the Secretary, the Chief Privacy Officer, the Chief Data Officer, and the State Chief Information Security Officer (SCISO). The modifications proposed by SB 247 will enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of MMOC. By focusing on industry best practices, strategic investments, and funding sources, MMOC will be better equipped to address the evolving challenges in IT and cybersecurity.
