Baltimore County **SUPPORTS** House Bill 666 – Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program – State Supplement. This legislation ensures that any person receiving federal SNAP benefits less than \$95 will receive additional benefits from the State. Furthermore, it eliminates the age qualification for the benefits provided by the State's expansion of SNAP, and increases the threshold amount for federal benefits.

Low-income Maryland residents have seen their cost of living increase sharply due to the inflationary effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The average cost of groceries in Maryland is over \$300 a month for one person. This legislation will help ease the burden of these high food prices on working families.

Ensuring that every child receives access to fresh, healthy foods is a priority for Baltimore County. HB 666 will further critical initiatives taken in the County, such as Summer SNAP for Children, to reduce food insecurity and increase access to healthy and fresh foods. Baltimore County appreciates the continued partnership between the State and the County in ensuring that our vulnerable populations have access to the food they need.
