Re: HB 1024 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Connection Pipe Emergency Replacement Loan Program – Expansion

Good Afternoon Chair Korman, Vice Chair Boyce, and Committee Members:

My name is Kelly Caplan, and I am the Division Manager for Customer Engagement & Advocacy at WSSC Water. I am here to testify in support of the HB1024 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Expansion of the Connection Pipe Emergency Replacement Loan Program.

The proposed legislation will allow for the expansion of the program authorized by the Public Utilities Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland Section 23-205 to include sewer service line repair or replacement, camera investigation, or snaking. Currently, this program only covers water service line replacement. Additionally, the proposed legislation increases the maximum loan amount from \$5,000 to \$10,000. The request also would extend the program's sunset date from 2029 to 2034.

WSSC Water established the Connection Pipe Emergency Replacement Loan Program. This program began on July 1, 2019 and is set to expire on June 30, 2029. There is currently \$100,000 allocated in the annual budget for this program; if passed, that amount is proposed to be increased to \$200,000.

The program provides loans to eligible residential customers to finance the replacement of their leaking water service line that connects from the Commission's service connection to the residence. This program is administered by the WSSC Federal Credit Union. Despite a robust promotional plan, only six loans have been disbursed since 2019.

Expansion of the program would provide an additional way for this funding to be leveraged for customers in need of water or sewer work. Additionally, these repairs and replacements can often

exceed \$5,000. Through the relationship and conversations with the Washington Suburban Master Plumber's Association (WSMPA), they have suggested we expand the Connection Pipe Emergency Replacement Loan Program to include sewer repair and replacement work. Since these members of WSMPA work directly with our customers, this insight is critical to providing a more comprehensive loan program to our customers.

The proposed legislation aligns with WSSC Water's financial stewardship priority and this initiative would expand an existing customer assistance program. For the last few years, any remaining funds from PipeER at the end of the fiscal year have been donated back to the Water Fund to assist even more customers with their water and sewer bills.

We respectfully request a favorable report for HB 1024. I am available to answer any questions you may have.
