In the approximately 6 months that I have been a graduate worker at UMCP, it has been made crystal clear to me by the university why we as graduate workers are in dire need of a union. I have had to deal with seemingly constant payroll mistakes, incompetence on the always changing health insurance rules, and an incredibly bloated university bureaucracy. But these issue pale in comparison to housing. All the housing around UMCP is either grossly overpriced or cheap and very low quality. My current situation is paying \$1000/month and I have 5 housemates. It is unacceptable that we are paid so poorly that that is the only affordable option for most graduate workers at UMCP.
