Senate Bill 997- Health - Vital Records - Electronic Filing and Storage - FAVORABLE WITH AMENDMENTS

Dear Chairwoman Beidle, Vice-Chair Klausmeier and Members of the Senate Finance Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on the proposed amendment to Senate Bill 997 that would update and enhance the capabilities of the State of Maryland Vital Records System (VRS).

Our more than 400 clients in Maryland include the Maryland Department of Health, where we are implementing Netsmart's electronic health record (EHR) system to support the MDH EHR modernization initiative for State-operated healthcare facilities.

We also provide VRS technology to the Florida Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics; the Nevada Division of Public and Behavioral Health, Office of Vital Records; the Illinois DPH Division of Vital Records; and several other state systems.

Transitioning the Maryland VRS to a single database will provide users with simplified, faster access and easier navigation to the information they are looking for. It will also provide a defined path for increasing the number of record types in the system as needed.

A single database and updated technology also:

- Simplifies the entry, validation, registration and retrieval of vital records
- Improves the timeliness and accuracy of information in the VRS database
- Automates processes with hospitals and other VRS partners through electronic data exchange
- Prevents errors by reducing or eliminating the need to key-in or re-enter information into the system manually
- Simplifies integration with law enforcement...a rapidly-emerging VRS growth requirement
- Taps the full potential of the VRS workforce and enhances job satisfaction

On a larger level, an enhanced VRS should be a highly scalable, holistic system with interoperability with NCHS and support for data exchange between federal, state and local agencies (e.g., NCHS, SSA, CDC, DMV), using a variety of secure standards, such as HL7 and FHIR. It should also support federal agency reporting requirements.

The future of vital records needs to be interoperable and flexible, enabling greater connectivity and less time and effort for users. The amendment to Senate Bill 997 retains the foundation of the current statute while making an impactful transformation for the future.
