I am writing to express my strong support for Senate Bill 765, which establishes the Business Diversity Incubator Program and Fund in the Department of Commerce to provide grants to certain business entities to establish diversity and effective business incubators in the State, authorizing the Governor in each of fiscal years 2026 through 2031, to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$5,000,000 to the Business Diversity Incubator Fund, etc.

Dear Senate Finance Committee:

I am writing this letter to strongly urge you to vote YES on Maryland Senate Bill: 0765 — Economic Development –Business Diversity Incubator. As you likely are aware, this bill will allow the allocation of resources in the form of grants for the development of incubators. SB0765 authorizes the governor to include in the annual budget for fiscal years 2026-2031 an appropriation of \$5,000,000 to the Business Diversity Incubator Fund. These funds will be donated and used solely for the development of diverse and effective business incubators. The approval of the bill would be a substantial step towards advancing economically impoverished communities: a pivotal objective of Governor Wes Moore.

Foremost, an incubator assists entrepreneurs in establishing their business while providing guidance, business connections along with management training and, when sustainable, an office space to facilitate business. This bill would award an incubator organization between \$100,000 - \$400,000 for its development and long-term sustainability. The grant money will be awarded to qualified incubators who are selected after a competitive application process. Those incubators that are managed by socially or economically disadvantaged individuals, have experience supporting companies in the start-up stage, and have an established presence in underserved communities will have priority acceptance for the grant application. Therefore, the grant money should reasonably be used for its intended purpose.

The development of incubators is of such vital importance because of the growing number of entrepreneurs in the United States today. As mentioned, those incubators which are already established and assisting economically struggling communities will receive priority consideration for the grant. In these communities that are socially and economically disadvantaged, the number of entrepreneurs is continuously increasing. Many men and women in these communities may not have the qualifications, skills, or desire to maintain a standard job, but they have profound ideas and business models. With the assistance of an incubator these entrepreneurs and their businesses models can begin to burgeon into prosperous companies, effecting the development of impoverished communities and its members.

In closing, incubator development is very important for our communities, and the passage of this bill may very well save thousands of start-up companies in jeopardy of failing due to lack of support. An incubator would also encourage entrepreneurship and the development of start-up companies. Many communities will benefit from an alternative to the standard working lifestyle; with the help of an incubator, they will be able to reap the benefits that comes from being a successful business owner. This bill creates a business diversity incubator program and fund that awards grants to business incubators that adopt practices to achieve goals of targeting socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs and startups. Commerce is the administrator of the program and will award these grant funds to qualified incubators through a competitive application process. This bill recommends a \$5 million annual appropriation for fiscal years 2026-2031.

Background:

A study on Maryland's Innovation Competitiveness directed by the Maryland Technology Development Corporation (TEDCO) released in early 2023 reported that while Maryland ranks highly for its share of Black-owned and women-owned firms, there is still a significant gap between those populations' business ownership representation and populations representation. The study also found "it will take 43 years for women and 47 years for Black Marylanders to achieve parity in business ownership based on 2012–2019 (pre-COVID) average annual growth in business ownership by race, ethnicity, and gender¹." One recommendation from the study was to expand entrepreneurial leadership training and mentorship for people of color and women in order to reduce this gap more quickly.

Rationale:

Passage of this bill will allow qualified incubators to receive award grants to encourage focus on socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs. Incubators are crucial components of an ecosystem that will grow and encourage innovation and entrepreneurship in the State. Commerce is committed to equity and inclusivity in our efforts to increase our State's economic competitiveness, and the Business Diversity Incubator Program will help Commerce to develop better working relationships with Maryland's network of incubators while also supporting our State's entrepreneurs and those considering becoming entrepreneurs.

Commerce respectfully requests a favorable report on Senate Bill 765.

After diligent research I found a myriad of fellowships with successful cohorts. I began to apply to what seemed like it would be a good fit. Harvard's embattled president quietly built "diversity" ideology into every facet of campus life.

While affirmative action has been a longstanding practice at Harvard, other programs led by Gay were new. Following the death of George Floyd in 2020, Gay commissioned a Task Force on Visual Culture and Signage, which released a series of recommendations the following year for engaging in the "historical reckoning with racial injustice." The recommendations included a mandate to change "spaces whose visual culture is dominated by homogenous portraiture of white men." In particular, the report maintained, administrators should "refresh" the walls of Annenberg Hall, which "prominently display a series of 23 portraits, none of [which] depict women, and all but three of [which] depict white men." Who were these white men and why were they honored in the first place? The report does not say—their race and sex alone provided sufficient justification for their banishment.

In 2022, Gay implemented an initiative at the Faculty of Arts and Sciences for "denaming" any "space, program, or other entity" deemed racist by the faculty and administration. According to the <u>report</u>, commissioned by then-president Lawrence Bacow, these decisions would be "based on the perception that a namesake's actions or beliefs were 'abhorrent' in the context of current values." In other words, Harvard would use the standards of present-day social-justice activism to pass judgment on men who lived hundreds of years prior—at best, an ahistorical and deeply ambiguous method. As part of this project, Gay sent an email to the Faculty of Arts and Sciences community soliciting "requests for

denaming," promising to address the situation "through the lens of reckoning." Since then, the university has <u>grappled</u> with denaming multiple buildings, including Winthrop House, named after John Winthrop, governor of the Massachusetts Bay Colony, and his great grandson, also John Winthrop, a Harvard professor and president.

As president, Gay leads a sprawling DEI bureaucracy—officially, the Office of Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, and Belonging—that seeks to influence how students speak, think, and behave in relation to race. Though the university deleted nearly all DEI materials from its website following President Gay's disastrous congressional testimony related to the Hamas terror attack, I have recovered some of these documents through an Internet archive. Harvard's DEI administrators encourage students to internalize the basic narrative of critical race theory: America is a nation defined by "systemic racism," "police brutality," "White supremacist violence," and the "weaponization of whiteness." In another resource, students were invited to "unpack" their "White privilege" and "male privilege," and to consider their "White fragility," which stems from "the privilege that accrues to White people living in a society that protects and insulates them from race-based stress."

What is one to make of Gay's record as a whole? She is hardly a "scholar's scholar," as the university magazine tried to portray her, having published, according to her curriculum vitae, just 11 academic papers—nearly half
