As a union state but also a slave-holding state, Maryland was a major epicenter for the abolitionist movement, which laid the groundwork for emancipation, women's rights, and civil liberties in the US. As such, understanding the role and experiences of African American Civil War veterans helps us better understand and appreciate our state and national history.

The Maryland Commission on African American History and Culture is committed to discovering, documenting, preserving, collecting, and promoting Maryland's African American heritage. Therefore, we support the development of the Commission to Study African American Civil War Soldiers in Maryland. We would be honored to designate an MCAAHC commissioner to serve on this Commission to make certain recommendations regarding the funding, design, construction, and location of an appropriate memorial dedicated to African American Civil War soldiers and require the Commission to report its findings and

recommendation to the Governor and the General Assembly.
