Chair Pena-Melnyk, Vice Chair Cullison, and members of the committee, the Maryland Rural Health Association (MRHA), is in SUPPORT of House Bill 1155: Hospitals - Opioid Overdose - Medication-Assisted Treatment

Using the opioid restitution fund to fund this legislative for programs, services, supports, and resources for evidence-based substance use disorder prevention, treatment, recovery, or harm reduction that have the purpose of improving access to medications proven to prevent or reverse an overdose could greatly improve the lives and wellbeing of rural Marylanders.
