Bill: House Bill 884 – Public Health – Abortions – Coercion (Protecting Pregnant

Women Against Coercive Abuse and Human Trafficking)

Hearing: March 15, 2024

Position: Oppose

Planned Parenthood of Maryland opposes *House Bill 884 – Public Health – Abortions – Coercion*. We support the autonomy of all people to make reproductive health decisions. Reproductive coercion exists and is a serious problem. Reproductive coercion involves decisions about birth control, protection from sexually transmitted infections, and pregnancy.

We are concerned about the degree to which this bill stigmatizes abortion. Research demonstrates that, "findings in this area do not support the assertion that women are frequently coerced into abortions, but rather, that they are more often coerced into continuing a pregnancy." Stigmatizing abortion, particularly for individuals already facing difficult situations, can lead to psychological distress, as demonstrated by data analyzed from the Turnaway Study.
