HB 938—State-owned Nursing Homes-Deficiencies, Citations and Fines-Reporting Requirements- Request for Favorable Report

Dear Chair Pena-Melnyk and Members of the Health and Government Operations Committee

On behalf of the Maryland Military Coalition, and as its Communications Director, I am submitting testimony in favor of this bill. HB 938 requires that the Department, in this case the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs, provide notification when a contractor that they employ to operate a state nursing home receives a deficiency or adopts a plan of correction. When receiving a deficiency, the Secretary or his designee must notify the Governor, the Finance and Health and Government Operations Committee, and those assembly members that represent the district where the nursing home is located.

Maryland is home to Charlotte Hall, currently the only nursing home that the state operates. During COVID-19, Charlotte Hall residents suffered more than surrounding nursing homes as the home incurred more COVID-related deaths than the national average. When the situation came to light, inspectors suspected that residents had also been abuse. The contractor was fired, a new team was brought in and all residents were evaluated.

Since that time, Charlotte Hall has made steady progress, however, there continues to be some problems, which the <u>Secretary himself</u> said would take years to rectify. Today, the home has a 1 star out of 5 star quality rating by <u>Medicare</u>. There were 18 complaints in the last 3 years, and the facility had 45 citations in that same period.

Charlotte Hall accepts not only veterans, but also their spouses, as only one of a handful of veteran homes do. The residents represent the most vulnerable of populations, often being economically disadvantage. It is imperative that they be protected. More importantly, any future veterans' homes that will be built need to have the same oversight and protections.

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Our veterans need to be treated with dignity and respect. Events that took place at Charolotte Hall never should have been allowed to happen. Transferring responsibility for notifications to the Secretary is a step in the right direction.

The Maryland Military Coalition, is a voluntary, non-partisan organization representing 21 veteran service organizations who, in turn, serve over 150,000 Maryland uniformed services men and women and their families. The Coalition strongly supports HB 938 and asks for your *favorable report*.

Thank you to Delegate Crosby for sponsoring this important legislation.
