The Greater Bethesda Chamber of Commerce (GBCC) was founded in 1926. Since then, the organization has grown to more than 550 businesses located throughout the Greater Bethesda area and beyond. On behalf of these members, we appreciate the opportunity to provide written comments in opposition to Senate Bill 100— Criminal Law—Organized Retail Theft.

With the increase in organized retail theft in recent years, the Greater Bethesda Chamber appreciates the introduction of Senate Bill 100. This bill seeks to address an issue that impacts Montgomery County and jurisdictions across the state of Maryland. Just last summer, the Montgomery County Police Department arrested a group accused of stealing large amounts of items from eleven stores in the county, the loss suffered by these stores totaling just under \$50,000. Organized retail theft impacts the safety and well-being of retail employees and customers and impedes a businesses' ability to operate.

On behalf of our retail members, we appreciate Senator Watson's leadership on this issue and urge a favorable vote on Senate Bill 100.
