

We would like to add our support for Senate Bill 632. We feel that a family should feel safe from a neighbor watching and taping the family, including minor children, on their own property. You should have a reasonable expectation of privacy at your own residence and back yard. When one or more cameras are used to solely harass and stalk neighbors, this is not for security purposes.

Our granddaughters have feared being in their own yard and speaking freely because they are being listened to by a neighbor, who is an adult male. In this particular case, this was a new house and a new neighbor. It was very creepy that he wanted to watch all the neighbors. By his own admission, he has 12 cameras, and it is his right to watch all the neighbors, he is entitled to do this.

I understand, we have a right to protect and secure our property, we also have cameras on our property, but we don't move them to watch our neighbors. He not only moved them many times but has also tried to go over the boards that were put in place to block his view. This seems more like harassment and stalking than protection of his property.
