BILL: HOUSE BILL 597

POSITION: SUPPORT

EXPLANATION: House Bill 597 establishes a Public Safety Apprenticeship Program within the Department of Labor for the purpose of providing career opportunities for young individuals within public safety agencies. The bill also requires the Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission to develop mental health wellness policies that will promote safety and wellness at the entry level law enforcement agency.

COMMENTS:

- HB 597 provides Public Safety agencies such as DPSCS the opportunity to create positive relationships between young people, the community and corrections agencies.
