Subject: HB544 - Sexual Extortion, Stalking, and Revenge Porn - Statute of Limitations

Position: **SUPPORT**

The Legislative Committee of the Criminal Law & Practice Section of the Maryland State Bar Association (MSBA) Supports HB544 - Sexual Extortion, Stalking, and Revenge Porn - Statute of Limitations.

This bill removes the statute of limitations for the crimes related to sexual extortion, stalking, and revenge porn. These are currently classified as misdemeanors and, as such, carry a limit on the initiation of prosecution of one year.

These are serious crimes with personally devastating consequences that sometimes occur over a period of years. Revenge porn, like the posting of photos and material on social media, for example, can be largely invisible to the victim until much later than the action taken by the perpetrator. A one-year limitation is extremely short given the nature of the crimes and how they are investigated. To really protect victims, charges often need to be filed after the statute of limitations has expired under current law. In the larger context of criminal laws, we believe removing the current statute of limitations is preferable to reclassifying the crimes as felonies, which would achieve the same end but have more far reaching consequences.

For the reasons stated, we **Support HB544 - Sexual Extortion, Stalking, and Revenge Porn - Statute of Limitations**
