Please don't change the liability waivers for horseback riding. You are only going to hurt the little guy/gal by doing this. Horses are not cars or buildings. They have a mind of their own and can hear or see things we don't. Even the most docile, rider friendly horse will spook at something no human can detect.

I ride two days a week on a horse that is owned by someone who is an elementary school teacher and a parent of two young children. I am a retiree on a fixed income. Changing this ruling doesn't hurt big business, it hurts people like her and me. Higher expenses might cause me to ride less often. Without my leases, it would impact her financially.
