My name is Mahesh Aitha and I support House Bill 1363 which would require the Maryland State Board of Education to develop and mandate Asian American history in our schools' K-12 curriculum.

I am here to share my thoughts based on the facts about why there is a need to mandate the Asian History in our schools. Recent data suggests that Maryland has more than 10% Asian American population, and it is still growing at a rapid speed. The Asian History in the schools will surely help to connect the students from different cultures and communities. All these will help to build the positive, supportive and inclusive school system.
