Testimony of Victoria Leonard, Chair, Committee for Montgomery on
HB 1462: Higher Education - Anti Hate and Antidiscrimination Policies and Workgroup (Maryland Campus
Accountability and Modernization to Protect University Students Act)

Thank you Chair Barnes, Vice Chair Chang, and members of the House Appropriations Committee for the opportunity to submit testimony on HB 1462. My name is Victoria Leonard, and I am the 2024/25 Chair of the Committee for Montgomery. The Committee for Montgomery (CfM) is a cross-section of Montgomery County business, labor, education, civic, arts, and community-based organizations. Our mission is to advocate in Annapolis on issues of importance to Montgomery County and the State.
