This important bill will establish separate bargaining units for faculty and contingent, contractual, or temporary faculty, enabling a more equitable and comprehensive approach to labor representation in Maryland's academic institutions.

We believe that HB 661 will have a significant positive impact on the educational quality and stability within the State of Maryland. For these reasons, the Committee for Montgomery fully supports this bill and encourages the House Appropriations Committee to pass HB 661 in a timely manner.
