The struggles I have are the same as a lot of folks and that's scarcity. People don't always have disposable income. Because they share their stories with me, I undercut myself. I've given people interview clothes for free. I've sold folks inexpensive wedding dresses.

Even though I love my business, I struggle cutting through bureaucracy, like a lot of my community. I had \$600 in late fees this year because I was late paying sales tax. I am my business's bookkeeper, accountant, chief financial advisor, and security officer.

As a small business owner, I wake up every morning thinking about my business. I don't have anyone to push things onto. I am 100% accountable for all my successes and failures. It is frightening and beautiful.

In my years in business, I've heard countless stories from fellow business owners. We have a mutual sense of fairness and accountability. We believe if you're a business located in our state and your business utilizes all the benefits of doing business here, your business should pay its fair share. Me and other small business owners shouldn't be subsidizing bigger businesses that can afford accountants who help them avoid taxes. If they're benefitting from Maryland, They should pay it forward by paying their fair share of taxes.

I respectfully urge this committee to return a favorable report on SB 859.
