Honorable Senator Guzzone,

My name is Dave McDowell, Director of the Calvert County Department of Public Safety. I am writing in support of Cross-filled Senate Bill 0849. This bill will allow for additional funds to assist our firefighters in early detection multi-cancer screening. The additional funding will provide necessary testing to protect our local volunteer fire/rescue/EMS departments. This bill will add much needed grant funding to a top-priority service for our local heroes.

According to data from the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) cancer caused 66% of the career firefighter line-of-duty deaths from 2002 – 2019. Firefighters have a 9% higher risk of being diagnosed with cancer and a 14% higher risk of dying from cancer than the general U.S. population from research by the CDC/National Institute for Occupational Health and Safety (NIOSH). There have been numerous processes that have been put into place to reduce some of the cross-contamination of carcinogens that cause cancer; however early detection of cancer will be our biggest resource in combating this disease. I strongly encourage all committee members to vote in favor of this bill to increase funding for the Professional and Volunteer Firefighter Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program. Unison support of those who risk their lives daily for our safety is imperative.

Chairman and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in support of SB 849. My name is Donna S. Edwards, and I am the President of the Maryland State and District of Columbia AFL-CIO. On behalf of Maryland's 300,000 union members, I offer the following comments.

Firefighters risk their lives daily, battling fires and enduring exposure to toxic chemicals and fumes, and as a result, they experience a significantly higher rate of cancer. In 2023, the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF) reported that 72% of member line-of-duty deaths were due to occupational cancer¹, emphasizing the need for early detection and prevention.

SB 849 increases the annual amount the Governor may include in the budget for the Professional and Volunteer Firefighter Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program from \$500,000 to \$3,000,000, providing for continuous improvement of these technologies which could lead to earlier diagnoses and better outcomes for those impacted. Additionally, this bill allows the Secretary to use funds from the Program to support medical centers in their efforts to improve cancer screening, enhancing transparency, accountability, adaptability, and the creation of well-informed policy.

Given the nature of their profession and the inherent risk associated with it, we have the opportunity to support these brave individuals by ensuring they are provided with the essential resources needed to detect cancer. By providing funding for detection, we can help better prevent

The Professional Fire Fighters of Maryland represents more than 10,000 active and retired professional fire fighters and emergency medical services personnel who proudly serve the citizens of the State of Maryland.

SB849 would increase the annual budget authorization for the Professional and Volunteer Firefighter Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program from \$500,000 to \$3,000,000. Most significantly, it is important to emphasize the life-saving potential of this initiative and the importance of ensuring its continuous improvement through robust data analysis.

Firefighters face unique occupational hazards that place them at an increased risk of developing various forms of cancer. Due to frequent exposure to harmful chemicals and carcinogens, our brave men and women in the fire service deserve the highest level of care and early detection strategies. 3. Addressing a Critical Need:

Firefighters are a vital part of our community infrastructure, and their well-being directly impacts public safety. An increase to \$3,000,000 reflects a proactive approach to addressing their unique healthcare challenges and demonstrates a commitment to supporting those who protect us day in and day out.

Support for Data-Driven Program Improvement

In addition to increasing the funding, the legislation authorizes the Secretary of Health to use up to 20% of Program funds to support academic medical centers in collecting, analyzing, and processing outcome data. This component of the legislation is particularly critical for several reasons:

A robust data infrastructure will help create a feedback loop that informs the program. The outcomes of this analysis can lead to best practices that may improve the program and offer pathways to new or more advanced screening methods.

In summary, increasing the annual budget authorization to \$3,000,000 and allocating up to 20% of program funds for academic data analysis represent a strategic investment in the health and well-being of our firefighters. This legislation is a forward-thinking measure designed to enhance early cancer detection, drive technological innovation, and ensure continuous improvement through data-driven analysis.

On behalf of the members of Professional Fire Fighters of Maryland, we strongly urge the committee to issue a favorable report on Senate Bill 849.

The Maryland Association of Counties (MACo) **SUPPORTS** SB 849, which enhances funding for the Professional and Volunteer Firefighter Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program. This bill increases the authorized annual budget allocation from \$500,000 to \$3,000,000 and permits up to 20% of these funds to be used by academic medical centers for data collection, analysis, and processing. These measures will significantly improve access to critical cancer screenings for firefighters across the state.

Counties fully support improving the health and safety of firefighters and all employees. Local governments have already taken substantial steps to provide extensive health coverage, including cancer screenings for firefighters. However, many jurisdictions with constrained budgets rely on grant programs to support these efforts. SB 849 offers another tool to help counties fulfill their commitment to firefighter health and safety without imposing additional unfunded mandates on local governments.

Counties recognize the critical contributions of firefighters, and the additional exposures and risks they assume as part of their duties. Those who employ career firefighters already offer various forms of cancer screening, but this legislation would help enhance and underpin those programs, and provide essential resources for expansion and improvement. Additionally, supporting academic medical centers in data collection and analysis will help refine screening methods, ensuring their effectiveness and clinical utility.

Counties have historically championed forward-thinking Firefighter and EMS incentives such as MACo's 2024 initiative bill, which enhanced firefighter recruitment and retention tools. Additionally, counties encourage participation in the Maryland Professional and Volunteer Firefighters Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program. Expanding the program's funding will help ensure that all firefighters—both career and volunteer—receive necessary cancer screenings, ultimately saving lives and supporting long-term public safety efforts.


For these reasons, MACo urges the Committee to issue a FAVORABLE report on SB 849.

Dear Chair Guzzone, Vice Chair Rosapepe, and Members of the Committee,

I write as the President of the Career Firefighters Association of Frederick County, Maryland (IAFF Local 3666) - Frederick County's public employee organization that represents the over 600 men and women employed with the Frederick County Division of Fire and Rescue. I am writing to express my support for SB849.

This legislation, which increases funding for the Professional and Volunteer Firefighter Innovative Cancer Screening Technologies Program from \$500,000 to \$3,000,000 and authorizes the Maryland Secretary of Health to allocate up to 20% of program funds to support data collection and analysis by academic medical centers, is a critical next step for healthcare for Maryland's firefighters.

Firefighters face a significantly higher risk of cancer than the general public due to prolonged exposure to carcinogens in the line of duty. Cancer is now the leading cause of death among firefighters and while Maryland has taken important steps to address this crisis, additional funding is necessary. Passage of this legislation will:

- Expand access to innovative cancer screening technologies for firefighters across Maryland, including those in Frederick County;
- Improve early detection rates, ultimately leading to better treatment outcomes and saving lives; and,
- Allow for the collection and analysis of critical data through academic medical centers, ensuring that screening methods are continuously assessed and improved for maximum effectiveness.

We urge this committee to issue a favorable report on this bill and help ensure that Maryland remains a leader in protecting its fire service personnel from the devastating impact of occupational cancer.
