



## House Bill 501

House Bill 501 (HB 501) modernizes the state's apprenticeship system by expanding the definition of a qualifying apprenticeship, ensuring more Marylanders can access career training programs that align with industry needs. **By creating opportunities to increase the allowable apprentice-to-journeyperson ratio in non-hazardous occupations beyond 1:1, HB 501 enhances small business participation in apprenticeship programs, creates economic mobility for Maryland's workers, and expands economic opportunity for all Marylanders.**

Additionally, the Maryland Apprenticeship Incentive Program will provide much-needed support for employers investing in apprenticeship programs. By allowing businesses offset costs related to recruitment, training, and retention, this initiative makes apprenticeships a more viable and scalable solution for closing Maryland's workforce gaps.

Implementation of HB 501 should prioritize employer flexibility, minimal administrative burdens, and broad industry access to apprenticeship programs. The Maryland Office of Registered Apprenticeship Development must serve as a business-friendly resource, streamlining participation and clarifying apprentice-to-journeyperson ratio adjustments.

Expanding access to apprenticeship opportunities is a priority for the Chamber and broader business community, and HB 501 takes a critical step in addressing Maryland's workforce needs. For these reasons, the Maryland Chamber of Commerce respectfully requests a **favorable report** on **HB 501**.
