HB 128- Responding to Emergency Needs from Extreme Weather (RENEW) Act of 2025

I am a victim of climate change. When wildfire smoke from Canada reached Maryland in June of 2023 I developed a cough. I was eventually diagnosed with Sarcoidosis, a rare disease.
