## Position: Support

The Maryland State Family Child Care Association (MSFCCA) is a non-profit association advocating for registered family child care providers and large family child care providers in Maryland. These small businesses are a vital part of the childcare delivery and the early education system in Maryland. Family child care offers a unique learning environment, flexible enough to meet each child's needs individually and the special relationships formed by children of various ages in family child care enhances the learning experience for all.

MSFCCA's only concern is the financial impact during this current budget and the feasibility of implementing this program.
