Chesapeake Conservancy supports <u>HB 631 - Eminent Domain - Agricultural and Conservation Easements - Prohibited Taking.</u>

Quite simply, this bill just prevents the state, or any of its instrumentalities or political subdivisions, from taking -- by eminent domain -- privately owned property that is subject to a perpetual agricultural or conservation easement.

Land conservation isn't just about creating or enhancing parks for better mental and physical wellness. Among many other benefits, conservation helps improve water quality, helps keep the family farm in business, helps provides resilience against a changing climate, slows the biodiversity decline, and helps connect the present with the past. Conservation easements are critical investments into Maryland's future, while meeting the numerous green space needs that exist now.
