MCEC supports the intent and purpose of this legislation and applauds efforts to provide a funding source for loans and grants intended to expand building and transportation electrification in Maryland through the Regional Greenhouse gas Initiative auction revenue.

MCEC launched the Maryland Energy Innovation Accelerator in 2019 to assist Climate Tech Innovators facing challenges when trying to get their technologies to market. The organization implemented a three-phase program that includes a Pre-Accelerator, Launchpad, and Climate Technology Founder's Fund. Each phase offers tailored resources and services for each stage of the entrepreneurial journey.

The amendment, requested by the Maryland Energy Administration (MEA), authorizes the appropriation of funding approved with the passage of SB0960 and signed by the Governor in 2024. The restrictive deadline for the funds to move per language in the bill prevented the transfer. The amendment adjusts the timeline to allow the funds to be deployed for the intended purpose in FY2026.

MCEC appreciates your consideration and urges a favorable with amendment report on this legislation.
