## Senate Bill 103 - Boating Accidents - Reporting Requirement - Property Damage

I am Senator Simonaire presenting SB 103.

Out of <u>respect for the committee's time</u>, and since I worked with the **Department of Natural Resources and other stakeholders** on this <u>consensus legislation</u> with <u>no known</u>
<u>opposition</u>, I <u>asked my panel</u> to just submit written letters of support.

The JPR committee unanimously passed SB 585 which deal with the State Boat Act penalties and a reporting requirement during any boating accident.

We simply **ran out of time** in the House of Delegates <u>as they discussed the penalties</u> portion of the bill in the last week of session.

In that bill, there was **small noncontroversial provision** that <u>simply dealt with providing additional reporting information that DNR needed</u>.

To ensure that provision passes this year, the reporting section has been decoupled from the penalties and incorporated into this bill.

## To the bill, DNR stated:

"The bill clarifies that a vessel operator <u>is required to report</u> property damage accidents <u>including damage to navigational aid markers</u>, <u>lights</u>, <u>or identifiers</u> to ensure that the Department has this information, as the Department is <u>required to</u> report it to the United States Coast Guard."

We have seen when this <u>information</u> is not <u>provided</u>, Coast Guard requirements are not being met and it can <u>cause confusion</u> after the fact.

I ask for your favorable consideration.
