SB 312 - Natural Resources - State Parks - Maryland Golden Age Pass

I am Senator Bryan Simonaire presenting SB 312.

This is an easy bill as I worked with the Department of Natural Resources and other stakeholders to present this consensus legislation.

In order to expedite this hearing, I have asked my panel to only submit written support.

The **Department of Natural Resources** has a <u>State Park pass for seniors</u>. It is called the **Golden Age Pass** that can be obtained by <u>individuals 62 years of age or older</u> for a <u>nominal application fee</u>.

Currently, <u>Maryland law</u> lays out what privileges are associated with the Maryland Golden Age Pass in <u>Natural Resources Article 5-1009</u>, such as, <u>camp overnight</u> in any State Park at <u>one-half</u> of the established fee Monday through Thursday, excluding holidays.

However, **other privileges are** <u>NOT</u> **included in 5-1009** which are <u>granted to Golden Age Pass holders</u>, such as:

Free entry into State Parks

<u>Clarifying language</u> on <u>other passengers in the vehicle</u>

Unlimited and free boat launching in State Parks

While these other privileges are **included** in **regulations** or **website** publications, the <u>Golden Age Pass</u> section in law should be complete and <u>list all the major privileges granted</u> under this program.

Therefore, this **bill clarifies the privileges** that are granted under the Golden Age Pass.

There is **no fiscal impact** and there is **no opposition**.

For all these reasons, I ask for your favorable consideration.
