Testimony on SB 88 Election Law – State Administrator of Elections – Municipal Elections Education, Energy, and the Environment

Position: Favorable

Common Cause Maryland supports SB 88, which simply allows the State Administrator of Elections to enter into an agreement with municipalities to support the administration of that jurisdiction's elections.

Under current law, municipal governments are responsible for administering their elections. They serve as our "laboratories of democracy" as they can implement reforms that we hope to see at the state level: ranked-choice voting, lowering the voting age, and more. The City of Rockville, for example, was the first jurisdiction to establish a robust vote-by-mail voting program in 2019, where they saw a 12% increase in voter turnout. The state learned from their program and later adopted similar provisions as we improved our mail-in voting process following the COVID-19 pandemic.

SB 88 builds on their efforts to establish voting processes that work for all. The State Administrator of Elections can assist with implementing these reforms to ensure they achieve their intended goal. The additional oversight would also help to ensure they run secure and accessible elections in the future.

For these reasons, we request a favorable report.

Reason for Position:

The Maryland Municipal League supports Senate Bill 88, which will allow the State Board of Elections (SBE) to continue supporting municipal elections via MOUs.

SBE and Local Boards of Elections (LBEs) have been working with municipal governments for decades to provide support for municipal elections where it makes sense. This arrangement was threatened in the fall of 2024 when SBE was unable to identify any legislatively derived authority to support municipal elections and ordered LBEs to discontinue any support as well.

SB 88 fixes this by simply allowing SBE to enter into an MOU with municipal governments.

This is emergency legislation. As you may know, municipal elections are happening around the year, and there are dozens coming up this spring. They need this legislation in effect ASAP to ensure there are no disruptions to our local elections.

While Rockville's election process is not impacted by SB 88, we endorse it in support of smaller municipalities across the State. For many years, we have procured the services of the State Board of Elections through a contract with the Montgomery County Board of Supervisor of Elections to access the State voter database, touch screen voting equipment, and vote tabulation equipment. Without this legislation, smaller municipalities and others that have not used these processes would be blocked from accessing these critical services and essentially precluded from administering elections. Rockville is very supportive of the opportunity for all Maryland municipalities to engage in a partnership with the State of Maryland to administer their elections.

SB 88 takes a major step forward to support and preserve municipal elections. By having explicit authorization to enter into a memorandum of understanding with the State Board of Elections, all Maryland municipalities can continue to administer elections. SB88: Municipal Elections - Emergency Bill

Senate Education, Energy, and the Environment Committee Wednesday, February 5, 2025 2:00 PM

Maryland's 157 cities and towns conduct elections throughout the year. Dates, methods, and frequency are as varied as our municipalities.

The prior SBE Administrator engaged with the municipalities without the legal authority to do so. Our current Administrator prefers to act in compliance with State law.

<u>SB88</u> would authorize the State Administrator of Elections to enter into memoranda of understanding with municipalities, allowing for State support in municipal elections when possible.

Because it could apply to elections early in 2025, this is an emergency bill.

The amendment-- drafted in collaboration with SBE and the Maryland Municipal League-- would move the deadline for municipalities to request inclusion on the State ballot from 18 months to 9 months, allowing for additions in the 2026 Election.

I urge a favorable report on SB88.
