Dear Honorable Senators:

I represent the Western Maryland Sportsmen's Coalition, Inc. The Coalition is comprised of many hunting clubs and sportsmen's associations and thousands of their individual members living in Garrett, Allegany, Washington, Frederick, and Carroll Counties. As President of the Coalition, I work together with the leadership of these Western Maryland Sportsmen's organizations for the recognition and benefit of the sportsmen and sportswomen of the five most western counties of Maryland.

On March 4, 2025, the Senate Education, Energy and the Environment Committee will be hearing the advantages and disadvantages of SB-0449 (Frederick and Washington Counties – Bow Hunting – Openly Carrying Handguns):

I, as a private citizen of this state and as the elected representative of the Western Maryland Sportsmen's Coalition, Inc. strongly urge you to support and vote favorable on this bill.

The western counties of Maryland sustain the state's highest concentration of black bears. Over the past decade, the black bear population in this region has been steadily increasing. Along with this population growth, the encounters between deer bow hunters and black bears have increased dramatically. More and more often bow hunters report harrowing experiences of black bears, sometimes climbing the same tree that the hunter in his/her tree stand is occupying. In addition to dangerous wildlife, bowhunters are vulnerable to outdoor crime while

afield. For these reasons bowhunters in Western Maryland should be allowed to carry a firearm for their protection.

In February of 2014 similar legislation (SB 231) passed in the state Senate by a 43 to 2 vote and subsequently through the House 120 to 9. That bill permits bowhunters who are otherwise authorized to carry a handgun to openly carry while afield for protection while hunting in Deer Management Region A.

SB-0449 simply recognizes the regional growth population of black bears in Western Maryland counties and seeks to expand the ability of bowhunters in Washington and Frederick counties of Deer Management Region B to protect themselves from harm in extreme circumstances.

Together with the sportsmen and sportswomen of Western Maryland, we strongly urge you to support and vote favorably on SB-0449.

Senate Bill 0449 Frederick and Washington Counties – Bow Hunting Openly Carrying Handguns FAVORABLE

Current law provides that a bow hunter may wear and carry a handgun while hunting deer in Region A as a reasonable precaution against black bears. As shown on the map below, Region A is comprised of Garrett and Allegany Counties and the western portion of Washington County. Due to successful conservation practices, the black bear population has increased in Area A and the black bear population has now significantly increased in the remaining portion of Washington County and into Frederick County.

This bill simply extends the area where a bow hunter may carry a handgun to include all of Washington and Frederick Counties.
