This letter serves as an official notification of support for HB-1184 from the Cecil County Branch of the NAACP. We are writing to urge your support for HB-1184, a bill that takes a targeted and strategic approach to preserving Snow Hill, one of Maryland's earliest free Black communities.

As members of the Branch and registered voters throughout the county, we care deeply about preserving Maryland's Black history, and believe this bill is a smart, necessary step to ensure this vital piece of our state's past and it should be properly recognized and protected.

By narrowing the project's scope, HB-1184 allows the state to efficiently allocate its resources toward the historical and archaeological preservation of Snow Hill, while Port Deposit and the Bainbridge Development Corporation move forward with restoring the historic Tome School site using their secured funding. This streamlined approach ensures the preservation efforts can move forward more quickly and effectively.

This bill is about taking action now to safeguard Maryland's history before these sites deteriorate further. Snow Hill is not just a local story—it is a statewide treasure that deserves immediate attention.

In supporting this bill it will allow legislation to correct a pass wrong in preserving our history; will enable Cecil County to renew it's previous reputation of racism – our goal is to eliminate it; educate ALL members of our community of the importance of our history no matter the color of the skin of those who created/lived it; and most importantly, to help our community to embrace our differences (that are less than our similarities) which will support healing and acceptance by all people.
