RE: HB 1302 Housing and Community Development – Housing Counseling

Dear Chairman Korman:

The Maryland Building Industry Association, representing 100,000 employees statewide, appreciates the opportunity to participate in the discussion surrounding HB 1302 Housing and Community **Development – Housing Counseling.** MBIA opposes the act in its current version.

This bill requires all recipients of funding from the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for any residential building project to offer housing counseling services to prospective residents. It is unclear whether the developer would be responsible for covering the cost of these services. Our members do not oppose simply offering a prospective homebuyer a referral to a qualified housing counseling professional. Requiring developers to provide funding for these services will add unnecessary costs to affordable housing projects. Prospective homebuyers can already request for free or low-cost housing counseling services directly through the U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Department is required to provide free housing counseling services to potential homebuyers who cannot afford to pay the fee.

For these reasons, MBIA respectfully requests the Committee give this measure an unfavorable report. Thank you for your consideration.
