Dear Committee Members;

I am writing today to ask for your assistance in opposing House Bill 1525 currently moving through the legislative process. This bill is evidently meant to solve an issue in one specific county and their municipalities in the State; however, the detrimental effect on your only municipality is significant. Attached you will find the Town of Leonardtown's Proposed Land Use map for our State required Municipal Growth Element of our Comprehensive Land Use Plan ten-year update. This draft update was submitted to the Maryland Dept. of Planning in January 2025 and comments are due back to us next week. The Town has been working on this plan in earnest since 2019. We are acutely aware of how easily our Town could revert back to the days of the late 1990's and the early 2000's and fully believe this plan lays the groundwork for continued success of this area.

We are not actively seeking annexations to grow our boundaries but have numerous businesses and developers who are actively seeking projects in the Town. All of the land surrounding the Town has no planned water and sewer unless they are given access to the Leonardtown water and sewer. We believe that just like St. Mary's County, if we are stagnant and have no opportunity to grow in a planned manner, we run the risk of losing our major economic engine, Patuxent River Naval Air Station, as well as no longer being a good community to live and do business in.

In addition to being the County seat of St. Mary's and the only municipality,
Leonardtown is part of one of two development districts in St. Mary's. The Leonardtown
development district actually extends beyond our borders to the east along Cedar Lane Road.
This area happens to also be where the line for Legislative Districts 29A and 29C are drawn. HB
1525 would prohibit the future residential growth of the Town in an area that after over 6 years

of work has been designated as our future growth area in our draft Comprehensive Plan and is slated for adoption in April. It is as already included in the County development district and has no outside water or sewer available.

There are many reasons this area has been proposed as the future growth area for Leonardtown. One being that it has many major access roads leading to the area and does not rely solely on Route 5. Which as we all know is a state road that needs significant investment and is no longer in the funding cue for many years.

I am happy to provide any additional information regarding this topic as we ask for your support in defeating this detrimental bill as it moves from the House Rules Committee to the Environment and Transportation Committee for a hearing on March 12th at 1:00 pm. As a member of this committee, we want to make sure you have all the information you need in deliberating this bill. It is our understanding that the Maryland Municipal League has also opposed this bill. Thank you for consideration of this request.
