RE: HB 817 - Residential Leases - Use of Algorithmic Device by Landlord to Determine Rent - Prohibition - Favorable with Amendments

Dear Chair Korman and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of TechNet, I'm writing to share remarks on HB 817 related to the use of algorithmic devices by landlords to determine rent.

Artificial intelligence (AI), machine learning (ML), and the algorithms that often support artificial intelligence have generated policymaker interest. We acknowledge that as technological advances emerge, policymakers' understanding of how these technologies work is vital for responsible policymaking. Our member companies are committed to responsible AI development and use.

TechNet is interested in HB 817 and is requesting an updated definition for "Nonpublic Competitor Data". We're requesting the sponsor strike lines 3-16 on page three and insert the following definition that has been used in at least one other state:

 "Nonpublic competitor data" means information that is not available to the general public, including information about actual rent amounts, occupancy rates, lease start and end dates, and similar



data, regardless of whether the information is attributable to a specific competitor or anonymized, and regardless of whether the information is derived from or otherwise provided by another person that competes in the same or a related market.
