## BILL: <u>SJ0001 (HJ0003</u>) Ratifying the Federal Child Labor Amendment COMMITTEE: Senate Finance Committee POSITION: Support

We advocate for adequate funding, equitable policies, and transparent accountability for the estimated 900,000 diverse students\* in Maryland's public schools, regardless of their academic, cultural, economic, geographic, racial, or other demographic status.

MEC supports the ratification of SJ 1 - Ratifying the Federal Child Labor Amendment which would provide the U.S. Congress 4 with the power to limit, regulate, and prohibit the labor of minors; and generally relating to the federal Child Labor Amendment. We believe child labor policy should be standardized among all states and protect children from labor practices that are not age appropriate, safe or healthy.
