## House Bill 418 – Health Maintenance Organizations - Payments to Nonparticipating Providers - Reimbursement Rate

Chairman, Vice Chairman, and members of the committee thank you for the opportunity to present House Bill 418 – Health Maintenance Organizations - Payments to Nonparticipating Providers - Reimbursement Rate.

Maryland has a history of successfully addressing nonparticipating physician payment in both HMO and PPO markets through fair and transparent payment methodologies.

- Resolution of PPO Surprise Billing: Maryland resolved its PPO surprise billing issue in 2010 by requiring insurers to reimburse hospital-based physicians who accept assignment of benefits according to a statutory formula, ensuring fair negotiations and preventing insurers from lowering the benchmark rate annually.
- Positive Impact of AOB Law: Maryland's AOB law has been effective in protecting patients from surprise billing, increasing physician network participation, and reducing the frequency of out-ofnetwork payments since its implementation in 2010.
- House Bill 418: House Bill 418 aims to align HMO and PPO laws by establishing a date certain for
  out-of-network rate calculations, and applying a "greater of" methodology to ensure providers do
  not receive payments below what they are receiving after passage of this bill.
- These measures work to ensure fair reimbursement calculations and encourage carriers to come to the table and negotiate fair contracts.

For these reasons we ask for a Favorable report on House Bill 418.
