I take great pride in the sacrifices I and my family have made over the years to be able to serve my community in their most vulnerable times of loss. To allow a "non-profit" version of a Funeral Home to open and operate in the great State of Maryland is reckless. They are not held to the same standards as your "average" funeral home nor are they required to follow the same rules and regulations as us. This opens the door for the consumer (our community) to be taken advantage of, receive subpar services and quite frankly is blatantly disrespectful to the licensed professionals who work hard to uphold and provide quality services within the realm of the law(s). Morally and ethically, passing this bill would be a huge, embarrassing disservice to our community. Where are the funds going to be held for preneed accounts? Where are the funds going to come from when there is a lawsuit because of their inexperience and negligence? Who is funding this and where did that money come from? Upstanding Funeral Homes in our community will suffer from the nonprofit's inevitable mistakes and lose the trust we have built for decades. The Attorney General assigned to assist the Board of Morticians allowed Heaven Bound to disgrace our namesake for over a decade and did so knowingly. Do you really want to open Pandora's box by allowing a fractured system to allow a" non-profit" to operate freely and unregulated with no experience? I would certainly not want my name to be associated with this alleged nonprofit when it inevitably implodes.
