Dear Chair Peña-Melnyk and Committee members:

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) respectfully submits this letter of support for House Bill (HB) 94 – Opioid-Associated Disease Prevention and Outreach Programs - Appeals and Membership of Standing Advisory Committee.

HB 94 will transfer responsibilities currently held by the Deputy Secretary of the Public Health Administration, as outlined in Article - Health - General §§24–902, 24–904, and 24–905, to the Secretary of Health or the Secretary's designee. The statutory amendments will allow the Secretary to assign these responsibilities as necessary to the appropriate designee within the department without requiring new legislation.

MDH promotes and enhances the health and safety of all Marylanders through disease prevention, access to care, quality management, and community engagement. Recently, MDH restructured programs to colocate divisions with similar goals under the same administration. One recent transfer was the Center for Harm Reduction Services (CHRS) from the Prevention and Health Promotion Administration (PHPA) to the Behavioral Health Administration (BHA), resulting in the need for this legislation.
