Background & Challenges Before SDS (Traditional Services):

For two years, Matthew was placed in a traditional service model that failed to meet his needs, leading to severe behavioral and emotional struggles:

- Daily emotional meltdowns at home, lasting over an hour, with screaming, crying, and self-harming behaviors.
- **Increased use of medication for depression**, but even with higher doses, his mental health did not improve.

- Mood stabilization—he now has more happy and balanced days.
- Reduced medication reliance—despite lowering his depression medication dosage, his mood remains stable.

- Eliminated aggression toward his mother, marking a major behavioral breakthrough.
- Work Possibility in Campus Program participation, helping him develop job-related skills and build social connections.
- Community engagement—volunteering at the public school library and Spirit Club, significantly improving his social confidence and communication skills.
- His quality of life has dramatically improved, thanks to SDS giving him control and choice over his daily routine.

- Prevents regression and ensures continued progress in social and vocational skills.

Call to Action:

Governor Wes Moore's proposed budget cuts to Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) put individuals like Matthew at serious risk. Reduced funding would:

- Jeopardize his care hours, threatening his behavioral and emotional stability.
- Undo the incredible improvements he has made in self-regulation, mood, and social engagement.
- Force families into unsuitable, ineffective programs that previously failed them.

I urge you to protect and prioritize SDS funding within HCBS programs. Without it, families like ours will face unnecessary hardship, and Matthew's well-being will be jeopardized. Please ensure that individuals like Matthew continue to thrive through the support of SDS.
