## Senate Bill 157 – Maryland Disability Service Animal Program – Established

I am Senator Simonaire presenting SB 157.

This bill passed this committee <u>unanimously last year</u>, but we <u>ran out of time in the House</u> without a crossfile.

It is crossfiled this year.

Since this is a <u>sponsor only hearing</u>, please see the <u>written testimony</u> and note there is <u>no opposition</u> again this year.

Over the interim, even though there is <u>no mandated money</u>, I worked with key members of the <u>Budget committee</u> to <u>gain their support</u>, as you can see by my <u>co-sponsors</u>.

So, to briefly <u>refresh your memory</u>, this bill is <u>modeled after</u> the <u>successful Service Animal program</u> in the <u>Department of Veterans and Military Families</u> where it has <u>been running since 2017</u>.

<u>Basically</u>, it creates a <u>similar grant program</u> in the Department of Disabilities that <u>partners with nonprofits</u> that <u>train service animals</u> to <u>help those with disabilities</u> and the Department's <u>unique</u> challenges.

Regarding the fiscal note, as we noted last year the assumption is that this program is funded at the current level of the Veterans Program.

- 1. As we did with the Veterans Program, private donations are allowed to fund this program. I had a <u>fundraiser the first year</u> to provide funding, and <u>Delegate</u> <u>Lehman is Crossfiling and we</u> have already talked about a <u>fundraiser</u> to fund it the first year.
  - 2. Looking at the Vets Program, it did not require any additional staffing, and
- 3. Finally, the <u>administrative cost</u> in the fiscal note are only estimated to be <u>less</u> than \$8,000 annually.

If you want me to go into <u>more depth</u>, I can but I know it passed <u>unanimously</u> last year, so I will stop there and ask for your <u>favorable consideration</u>.
