Declaration of Rights - Religious Freedom, Religious Tests, and Oaths and Affirmations

The Episcopal Church has endorsed Article 18 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the landmark declaration of international law and human rights that expressly protects the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion and states as follows: *Article 18*. Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance.

This is consistent with the First Amendment of the United States Constitution and Article 36 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights. According to cases decided pursuant to the First Amendment, that freedom includes the right not to believe in God. We believe that people of every faith tradition should be able to worship as they see fit. We expressly endorse that freedom as also meaning that a person has an unalienable right not to believe in God.

We strongly request a favorable report.
