- Ensure supervised care, reducing risks associated with his condition
- Support family well-being by providing respite and structured caregiving

Without these services, Eden faced heightened risks and social isolation. Continued funding is essential to maintain the progress he has made and ensure his future stability.

Why Self-Directed Services (SDS) Matters for Eden:

Although Eden is not currently participating in the SDS program, his family recognizes its critical importance for his future. SDS would allow:

- Personalized Care: Ensuring he receives tailored support suited to his behavioral and developmental challenges.
- Flexible and Consistent Supervision: Enabling his family to hire caregivers who understand his needs and can provide specialized support.
- Long-Term Stability: Preparing him for adulthood with structured services that promote independence and safety.

The ongoing budget cuts to SDS funding put Eden's future at risk. Ensuring access to this program is crucial for his continued care, safety, and development as he transitions into adulthood.
