Background & Challenges Before SDS:

• Severe epilepsy and developmental delays since infancy.

- Severe side effects from anti-epileptic medications left him unable to stand or walk for three years, forcing him to rely on a wheelchair.
- Caring for Seungwoo became physically and emotionally overwhelming for his family.
- His parents had to relocate from a third-floor apartment due to the difficulties of lifting and assisting him.
- His parents also **struggled to maintain employment** due to his high care needs.
- When he turned **21**, his family sought **DDA services** but was unable to find an agency that could **meet his complex medical and physical needs**.

Improvements After SDS (Personalized 1:1 Support):

- **Regained the ability to walk**, though he still requires constant supervision.
- Actively participates in community activities, improving his well-being and independence:
 - **Swimming** to improve mobility and manage his physical condition.
 - **Fitness training** to regain strength and endurance.
 - Church gatherings for social engagement, emotional stability, and spiritual support.
- **Increased quality of life**, with a greater sense of happiness and engagement in daily activities.
- Family stability improved, as his parents are now able to provide dedicated care while maintaining a structured and manageable daily routine.

Why SDS Matters:

- **Provides essential, highly specialized care** for individuals with complex medical needs.
- Restores mobility and independence, allowing individuals like Seungwoo to engage with their communities.
- Prevents families from falling into crisis due to lack of appropriate services.
