Re: Support for House Bill 508 – State Procurement Preferences for Blind Industries and Services of Maryland

As the Chief Executive Officer of Maryland Works, Inc., an organization dedicated to advancing employment opportunities for individuals with disabilities and other barriers to employment, I am writing to express my strong support for House Bill 508, introduced by Delegate Kerr.
