It is our mission to "add *HERstory* to history to tell OUR story". More now than ever, the voices and stories of women appear under threat of having their struggles and successes erased from history. We understand that there are currently huge legislative issues to be addressed, but that has long been an explanation why diverse women's lives and contributions are often overlooked or denied.

The Maryland Witches Exoneration Project has collected their names and researched their lives.

Let us say their names, learn their stories and remember what their lives were like:

Mary Lee- Hanged at sea
Rebecca Fowler- hanged
Moll Dyer- Driven from her burning home, found later frozen to death
Virtue Violl- Acquitted and seeking to clear her name
Elizabeth Bennett- Later cleared
Hannah Edwards- Not guilty
John Cowman- Decision to hang was reversed
John Cowman – Was not hanged
