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SB 311 - "Government Officials' Family Protection Act of 2025"

I am Senator Bryan Simonaire presenting SB 311.

As you know last year, the **senate unanimously passed** SB 480 that provided protections for <u>election</u> <u>workers</u> and their <u>immediate family due to the rise of threats</u> against election workers.

Sadly, while we provided protection for <u>election worker's families</u>, our **elected official families** do <u>not</u> <u>receive</u> the <u>same protections</u>.

It **may not surprise you**, but **threats** to <u>elected officials and their families</u> have <u>increased</u> as well, and <u>most notably in the last couple years</u>.

But is it not just happening nationally - According to the State of MD:

During the period between 2014-2022: threats reported did not exceed 10.

<u>During the years from 2023 – 2024</u>: There were 21 reported threats with 2 threats against family members.

This bill aims to provide the **same protections** that we give to election worker's families to elected official's families.

This is **accomplished by** altering the existing <u>elected official</u> protections in Criminal Law 3–708 to include protections for immediate family members.

In fact, the '*immediate family*' language used in this bill is **word for word** from last years' bill as it applied to <u>election workers</u>.

That means protections for your parents, your spouse and your children.

Sadly, <u>more and more families</u> are being **drawn into a world of violence** they <u>never should have to</u> <u>experience</u>.

Politics has changed since I came in the Senate in 2007.

People are more emboldened to threaten elected officials and their families.

To be clear: **Current protections** for <u>elected officials</u> **do not include** protections for their <u>immediate</u> <u>family members</u>.

It would be **hard to justify** protecting an <u>election worker's</u> immediate family member from threats **but deny those same protections** to an <u>elected officials'</u> family member.

I firmly believe <u>elected officials</u> who are performing a public service and are <u>often the target of threats</u> deserve to have those <u>same protections</u> extended to their <u>family members</u> who, at times, are drawn into **threats simply by association**.

The **General Assembly** has seen an <u>increase in serious threats</u> to <u>individuals and collectively</u> as a body. Just within the last year, this body has <u>received several bomb threats</u> requiring evacuation of the whole complex.

<u>Threats have increased locally as well</u>. For example, in the last 3 years, **Anne Arundel County** had a **total of 24 threats against** their local elected officials.

We **cannot wait for a threat to become a reality** against our family members. We need to act just as <u>decisively as we did last year</u> and provide protections for <u>elected official's</u> family members as we did for <u>election workers</u> and their family members.

I ask for your favorable consideration.
